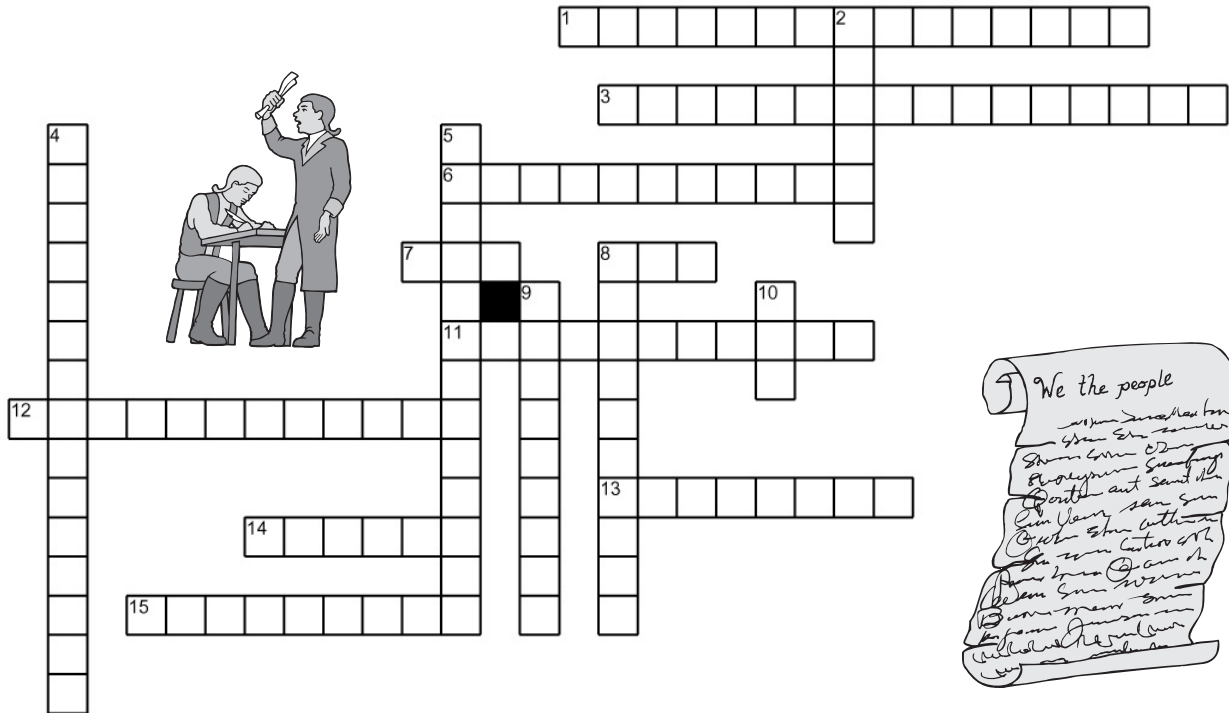


# Celebrating Constitution Day
